STEPHEN MINISTRY

During the 9:30 A.M. worship service on February 21st, four lay people were commissioned into a special ministry of caring for others as Stephen Ministers. This rite of commissioning culminates 50 hours of extensive training and preparation for this ministry through the Stephen Series, a program for lay caring ministry developed and administered by Stephen Ministries St. Louis. Regina Harris led the training sessions with assistance from Pastor Condrey and Bill Gilbert.

The Stephen Ministers commissioned were April Mershon, Chris Wood, Donna O'Hara and Steve Hudgins. We think God for their gifts of caring and listening. They have spent time studying and practicing skills in such areas as dealing with feelings, crisis intervention, asserting oneself with gentleness and firmness, and numerous other topics to prepare them to



help people who are experiencing problems in their lives. Additionally, Steve Hudgins went through training in January to become a Stephen Leader.

Last year Bill Gilbert and Scott Coverdale were commissioned as Stephen Ministers so we will begin this wonderful ministry in April with five Stephen Ministers.

Although we will be providing specific information over the next few weeks about this ministry, here are the general steps for requesting a Stephen Minister.

- 1) Contact Pastor Condrey or one of the Stephen Leaders who are Regina Harris and Steve Hudgins. They will discuss the request to determine if it meets the criteria to have a Stephen Minister.
- 2) A Stephen Leader will contact and meet with the individual to explain how the *confidential* process works and then assign a Stephen Minister.
- 3) The Stephen Minister will contact the individual to schedule a meeting and determine next steps.

Please keep these Stephen Ministers in your prayers as they carry the love of Christ to others.

Envelope Numbers are IMPORTANT

As you fulfill your financial stewardship through KirkWood, please help your Offering Counter Teams by entering your offering envelope number on the memo line of <u>EVE-RY</u> check you write to KirkWood for <u>ANY</u> purpose, including regular offering, HOPE, Pastor's Fund, Flowers, *These Days* books, Men's/Women's Retreats, Adult/Youth Mission Trips, etc., etc. As part of the Offering Counter process, every check must have the donor's envelope number on it, even if the check was in the envelope. Therefore, by including your envelope number on every check, you don't even need to put it in your offering envelope... just drop your check in the offering plate. These two actions will save your counting team volunteers considerable time and will be greatly appreciated.

Also, if you send your offering to KirkWood using "on-line banking," please enter your KirkWood offering envelope number as your "account number." That way, the bank will include your envelope number on your check when they send it to KirkWood.


