
Hymnspiration




We won't have regular weekly rehearsals but instead will schedule rehearsals at convenient meeting times several weeks before we plan to ring at a Sunday worship service.

CHILD CARE WORKER POSITION



We are currently seeking someone to fill the position of Child Care Worker. This is an awesome opportunity for someone interested in working a few hours every Sunday morning. This position works together with another Child Care Worker to care for infants and children.

Qualified candidates must have previous child care experience, be at least 21 years old, have a clear testimony of faith, excellent interpersonal skills, and a High School diploma or GED. A background check will be completed by the church if hired for the position.

Candidates must be able to stand, walk, sit, reach with arms and hands to lift, hold and carry children up to 30 pounds, stoop, kneel, crouch, and crawl. Candidates must also be able to walk up and down stairs, and talk with and hear children and adults.

THE PRAY-GROUND IS OPENING

On July 29th and continuing on the last Sunday of each month, KirkWood will have a pray-ground open to give families another way to include their children in the sanctuary.

Carolyn Brown says, “As we seek to include children in the congregation’s worship it reminds us that the goal is not that they behave or even that they know enough of the songs and prayers to participate. **The goal is that they acquire and practice skills for living in relationship with God every day.**”

Inter-generational worship allows children to see that this relationship invites everyone. The KirkWood pray-ground will be in the front of the sanctuary to truly immerse children in the worship at a level that they can see. Foam flooring allows for additional seating options and a delineated area to wiggle.

When the pray-ground is open, there will be no Glory time. Quiet worship activities will be provided after the children’s message which are geared toward ages 4-6, but children of any age are invited to sit in this space with their families. Nursery will remain available as an option for those under 4 years old.






UPCOMING MISSION STUDY

Pastor Transition Update

As we have previously communicated, the next step in the pastor transition process is to create a team to conduct a Mission Study for KirkWood.

Goal of team - Conduct a comprehensive Mission Study for KirkWood Presbyterian Church to help determine the vision for its' future and goals for pastoral leadership

- **Session will create an ad hoc Mission Study team of 5-7 members with close association with our interim pastor to develop this Mission Study.**
- **The Mission Study team will develop a report on the findings for Session approval.**
- **It is imperative that the Mission study team gets extensive input and engagement from as many KirkWood members as possible** (young to our most senior members; 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. service participants; include input from all the different ministries within KirkWood; new members to our most tenured members.) **This is to be done through a series of town hall meetings, one on one meetings, info sessions, and extensive surveys.**
- **5 areas that the Mission Study team will explore:**
 1. **A comprehensive study into KirkWood's past and present** - What has worked? What has changed? What is no longer working?
 2. **What is the mission of KirkWood?**- Have we been following our current Mission Statement? Does that Mission Statement still mirror where we see God's role for KirkWood as we move to the future?
 3. **Connections of the church** - All the different KirkWood activities and groups, Scouts, PEVA, demographics of the surrounding community, etc.
 4. **Focus on future leadership needs** - Do we have the correct staffing for now and the future? Is Session configured to maximize its effectiveness for the future?
 5. **Develop a Vision Statement** - A summary of where we see God leading KirkWood in the future.



The skill set needs and requirements for members of the Mission Study team:

- **5-7 members (No more than 1-2 current Session members)**
 - **Chairperson-** experience leading major initiatives, understands big picture, is well organized, a strong communicator and listener, someone who can keep an open mind, a strong motivator.
 - **A person strong in data mining and analytics** (can understand demographics and trends)
 - **Someone who can think outside of the box**
 - **A person with strong writing skills**
 - **A person who knows how to develop strong surveys and lead town hall and info sessions**
 - **Someone who is highly skilled at setting up the logistics for these numerous events involving the congregation**
 - **Someone with superior communication skills and publicity skills**

Potential time line for the Mission Study team:

1. **Sept. 2018-** team members are identified by Session
2. **Sept. - Dec. 2018-** Mission study team organizes their strategies and does extensive research and background work as well as preparation for info sessions, one on one meetings, surveys, and town hall meetings.
3. **Jan. - Mar. 2019-** Mission study team engages as much of the congregation as possible in a series of info sessions, town hall meetings to get input and opinions, one on one meetings, and surveys.
4. **Apr. - June 2019-** Mission team completes study and develops conclusions and writes final Mission Study report to be submitted to Session for approval.
5. **June 2019-** target month for completion of the Mission Study report and submission to the Session
