Stewardship



Did you go on vacation and/or just miss attending a few Sundays at KirkWood? Did this cause you to miss paying your pledge or donation to KirkWood? Please take a few minutes to check your records to see how many weeks you have missed this year. Please write a check to KirkWood to make up for those missing weeks.

KirkWood has had some large expenses this year as well as the “must pays” such as electric, water, trash, copier, and insurance. The new air handler for air conditioning and the new TVs in the sanctuary are examples of large expenses.

Methods for paying KirkWood:

1. Put cash in your envelope. *Please write amount, cash, and any special use (flowers, pastor’s fund, etc.) on the front of the envelope.*
2. Write a check to KirkWood – *Remember to put your envelope number and any special use (flowers, pastor’s fund, etc.) on the check – even if you use your envelopes.* If you want envelopes, sign up in the narthex. You can have envelopes even if you didn’t pledge. It is easier for the counters if you just fold your check in half as you put it in the offering plate.
3. Make your payment online through your bank. They will mail the church a check each week or month. *Put your envelope number as your account number.* The KirkWood address and phone number are needed by the bank and can be found in the front of the bulletin.
