

The text of the chorus is:


“My lighthouse, my lighthouse

The group has begun work on our spring musical about Noah's Ark, "100% Chance of Rain." Here is our singing schedule through May:



## Spring Cantata




The music includes pieces by Joel Raney (who wrote our recent Christmas cantata), Mark Miller, Hank Beebe, Caleb French, and others.






# OUTREACH COMMITTEE


# MISSION COMMITTEE

## Mission

Last Spring's mission trip to Fayetteville, North Carolina was a wonderful and meaningful experience for the KirkWood team. We were able to work on six different houses during the week in the areas flooded during Hurricane Matthew in 2016. The Mission Committee is planning two trips for 2019! The first will be back to North Carolina, most likely to the town of Swansboro, Wilmington, NC where Hurricane Florence caused extensive flooding. We are still coordinating a date, probably in May. The second will be a joint adult and youth trip to Harrisonburg, VA. We will stay at Massanetta Springs Presbyterian Camp. Activities will include rehab projects, fellowship, fun, and opportunities to show God's love to those in need. Look for future announcements.



**CPK Mikondo support** - The Congo churches continue to struggle. Although the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia (PEVA) has been able to resume some wire transfers of money, the lack of funds during the interim resulted in many needs going unfilled. Pastor Bulabula sends his greetings and blessings for KirkWood's Transition Pastor Tucker. Continue to pray for our brothers and sisters in the Congo.



# MISSION STUDY TEAM UPDATE

## Mission Study Team


The Mission Study Team was created by the Session as an ad hoc team “to conduct a comprehensive Mission Study for KirkWood Presbyterian Church to help determine the vision for its future and goals for pastoral leadership.” Part of our mandate from the Session was to get extensive input and engagement *from as many KirkWood members as possible*.

The team is to study several key areas:

- **Heritage:** Who are we? Where did we come from? What is our story? What are our patterns of behavior?
- **Mission:** What are our core values? What is our vision? What are our goals? Where do we place our focus?
- **Connections:** Who do we relate to outside of ourselves? Who do we have relationships with? What is our relationship with PC(USA)?
- **Leadership:** How are we organized? What kind of leaders do we need? What kind of structure do we need to accomplish our ministry?
- **Future:** What does the future hold? How do we move forward? How do we achieve our goals and dreams?

Since November, the team has extensively reviewed historical documents, session minutes, etc., to get a ‘feel’ for the heritage of KirkWood, but we request additional input from the congregation on the ‘Heritage Tree’ that has been put up on wall in the Narthex.

*In the next few weeks, look for an online survey* to solicit congregational input on the other key areas of study. The Mission Study Team members will then meet with members via ‘town-hall’ meetings, with individual small groups/Bible study groups, and with other organizations in the church to fill out or expand upon what we learned in the survey.



Upon completion of the mission study, the team will compile its findings into a report to submit to the Session. This report will eventually be used by the Pastor Nominating Committee to compile our *Ministry Information Form* – the document that will tell any prospective pastoral candidate who we are. We obviously want this document to be as accurate and comprehensive as possible.


