Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers. – Acts 9:31 (NRSV)

You probably don't ever have these conversations where you are (cough, cough), but the church people I hang out with spend a fair amount of time thinking, reading, and talking about plans or programs designed to get the church to grow. Screens or no screens. Small groups or leadership training. One kind of music or another kind. And whatever the attractive program or plan is, it must lure the elusive "young family," seldom seen in the wild and not easily captured.

What if church growth, though, was less about a plan or a program and more about an orientation, an attitude, a way of being?

What if the most attractive feature of your church to young families (and old singles and all the configurations of humanity in between) was that you had the kind of true peace that confronted conflict in a healthy, unafraid way?

Ongoing Missions

Monthly Food Drive: We collect non-perishable foods and monies to support St. Luke's pantry the first Sunday of every month.

Monthly Offering—"Helping Other People Eat": We collect the H.O.P.E. offering the second Sunday of every month. Funds are divided between Youth Challenge, Mid-Atlantic Teen Challenge, Menchville House, and our sister church, CPK Mikondo, for their Feeding Program in Congo.





Communication Update

Outreach

Over the years, KirkWood has continued to increase the use of technology to facilitate better communications among our congregation. From amplified microphones for the sermon, to amplified music during our services, to projected slides and video during services and meetings, to broadcasting services on the internet via YouTube. And for communications during the week, besides printed material (bulletins and flyers) we've gone from telephone calls to emails and Facebook posts. Now we are introducing texting as a medium for communication.

We are not doing away with phone calls or emails, we are supplementing them. And we don't anticipate flooding your cell phone with texts, just those to keep you informed of important events or situations. We anticipate that it will be used to welcome new visitors (via YouTube or in-person) and invite them to continue to join us. We may use it to notify everyone of special circumstances involving worship services or other events (e.g., "Services canceled due to snowstorm"). Committee chairs or other leaders can use it to contact their committees or groups. Members are able to respond to these texts as soon as desired for additional information. (Replies are only sent to the person who sent the original text, not to everyone in the group.)

Obviously, this will only be available for people with cell phones. We solicit you to "opt-in" to this new platform by either:

(1) Texting "connect" to 757-772-0209, or Scanning the QR code to the right.



(2) "You will receive text messages from KirkWood Presbyterian. Message & data rates may apply. Messages frequency varies. Reply STOP to stop, HELP for help.

(3) Respond to the text you receive, which will ask for your name and email address. We will not unilaterally add you to our list of subscribers as we want to respect your privacy. You must do this yourself through the opt-in process.

We are happy to report KirkWood's Little Free Food Pantry has become quite successful in the surrounding community and is most assuredly meeting a need, especially in these summer months with schools and school lunch programs closed or on hiatus. We have a regular stream of visitors throughout the week! We are so happy that KirkWood's food ministry continues to bless others.

We regularly monitor the pantry supply and integrity and have found that the items being used more regularly are canned meats such as tuna and chicken, boxed dry cereals, boxed dinners such as Hamburger/Tuna Helper, canned ravioli/spaghetti O's, peanut butter, and pasta/pasta sauces. Thank you to everyone who donates supplies or makes monetary donations towards the pantry. Please continue to place your items directly in the pantry; however, if it appears well-supplied, we ask that you place your items in the kitchen. We have a container labeled "Little Free Food Pantry".

We are happy to announce that you can now donate online as well as through cash/checks to help support the Little Free Food Pantry. We will use these monies as needed to keep the pantry stocked as well as for upkeep and regular maintenance of the structure.
