Without a doubt, the most effective Session members come in with no personal agenda. They work collaboratively with other people. They are open to different ideas and opinions and most demonstrate the ability to listen to others. Their goal is to help KirkWood grow spiritually and to help it be one unified body, sharing the Good News and making a difference in people's lives.

In addition to these qualities, the Nominating Committee looks for folks who have taken an active interest in KirkWood and have served on committees and/or, volunteered for different activities. They might have specific skills or interests like Outreach, Mission Work, Congregational Care, or Christian Ed. When we look for new Session members, we try to match our needs with the interests of the potential candidate.



The work can be challenging at times, but with 12 Session members, we work together and have each other's backs when the challenges get tough. Session is most effective when you have 12 people working together with the pastor and the staff and the congregation members for the greater good of KirkWood, growing together and sharing God's love while making positive impacts on people's lives.



What is The Little Free Food Pantry? Think Little Free Library, but with food! Too often, the communities around us face uncertainty when it comes to feeding their families. While many are able to live within a fixed budget, as we can all imagine, it simply takes an unexpected car repair, family/medical emergency, or any other unanticipated expense to cause a family to experience food insecurity.

With KirkWood's central and convenient location near a main roadway, as well as with the addition of sidewalks, we are uniquely situated to help our neighbors facing trying times. The Little Free Food Pantry is available 24/7, providing the opportunity for those community members in need to anonymously stop by and select a few food items to help feed their family until the next paycheck arrives and the financial picture improves.

A long time ago there was a king named David. He was a great man. Along with a wife, he had a son named Solomon. King Solomon is still known as the wisest of all kings, ever. Ever! He had asked God for wisdom, and God was more than happy to grant it to Solomon. Before David died, he gathered the materials in great quantity for a "house for God" (I Chronicles 22). It took approximately 7 years to build this magnificent building, the Temple of the Lord.

Once the Temple was finished, King Solomon dedicated it to the Lord. The dedication can be found in 2 Chronicles 6. As a part of the dedication, this prayer is stated:

"18 "But will God indeed dwell with mortals on earth? Even heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain you, much less this house that I have built! 19 Regard your servant's prayer and his plea, O Lord my God, heeding the cry and the prayer that your servant prays to you. 20 May your eyes be open day and night toward this house, the place where you promised to set your name, and may you heed the prayer that your servant prays toward this place."

God cannot be contained. God listens to our prayers. God's eyes are open continually towards us. God has set His name on us. Why do we not get the answers we seek? We don't ask God for them. Our pleas to God do not fall on empty ears.

For the next three months, the Stewardship committee invites you to make pleas known to God. On the next pages, you will find calendars for the months June & July.
