Prepare to Study God's Word

The **February Sunday School Curriculum** (8:30, 11:00 Adult, Children & Teens) focuses on diversity. As we move into this new study, here is what you can prepare for:

Honor God's Diversity (PCUSA Curriculum) January 29, February 5, 12, 19

God calls us to honor diversity that God has created in our world by diving deep beyond just accepting diversity. When we recognize and celebrate the different gifts, abilities, and voices in all creation, we honor the diversity in the world that God has created. God embraces our differences as He created all in the image of His own diversity. Honoring God's diversity helps us see those who are marginalized in our society and affirm them. Once we do this, we can work to bring those vital, diverse voices in from the margins to the center of the work God is doing in the world; to listen and learn from them. In listening to marginalized voices, we can hear the Spirit in its call for all of us to work for liberation while challenging oppression. In *Honor God's Diversity*, we learn to recognize and appreciate diversity as a valuable aspect of God's creation. We are challenged to look beyond the comfort of uniformity to identify the variety of life God gives.






The Little Book of Joy by Dalai Lama and Desmond Tutu
