Thin Places

"Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, 'Surely the Lord is in this place—and I did not know it!'"
– Genesis 28: 16

In Jacob's dream he sees a stairway to heaven with angels ascending and descending it. He named the place Bethel, "the place of God." The ancient Celts called such spots "thin places",

Thin places can be famous holy spots such as the Isle of Iona or the Cathedral de Notre Dame, but more often than not they are ordinary places, such as Bethel, or a dusty road on the way to Damascus.

You can search for thin places, but, as with Jacob, it is more likely that they will find you. Such unexpected encounters with the Holy



seem to happen in times of crisis: Jacob running away from home, Saul on his way to persecute the church.

Is it the place itself that allows for these glimpses of the advent of God? Or is it some special state of mind and heart? Either way there are times and places when the ordinarily reliable distinction between heaven and earth gets erased.

Even if we see no burning bush or ladder to heaven, nor hear the voice of Jesus, we are no less certain that we have come upon a thin place, and can say, as Jacob did, "Surely the Lord is in this place—and I did not know it!"

Prayer – "Keep us alive and alert, O God, in all places and times, that we may not miss the momentary glimpses of heaven You graciously provide, amen."







Thank You to all of KirkWood for your continued support of our Little Free Food Pantry. It has helped many families in need over the summer! Alert: the Pantry is on the move! Be on the lookout for its new location in the circle closer to the church under the trees. We are so happy that KirkWood's food ministry, including our own pantry and supporting larger needs through St. Luke's Food Pantry, continues to bless others.

We regularly monitor the pantry supply and integrity and have found that the items being used more regularly are canned meats such as tuna and chicken, boxed dry cereals, boxed dinners such as Hamburger/Tuna Helper, canned ravioli/spaghetti O's, peanut butter, and pasta/pasta sauces. Please be advised that items in the pantry should ideally be in their original packaging for the best food safety. For example, crackers should be kept in their original boxes and not have sleeves loose in the pantry. Additionally, carbonated beverages present a hazard to the pantry in both the heat and cooler months approaching. We have a box in the Narthex labeled for the Little Free Food Pantry, so feel free to place items there and/or directly into the Pantry. If you are interested in helping us monitor and organize the Pantry, the Mission Committee would welcome your help. 
Remembering our Neighbors' Needs

I've noticed that there are times when I have a hard time understanding or remembering someone's name. It could be due to the noise at the time, my hearing, other distractions, or time constraints. It is often easier to read a nametag.

With several new members and visitors, we would like to go back to wearing nametags to make it easier for everyone. The Worship Committee came up with the following idea so you will not have to keep track of your name tag. We will have the new name tags hanging on portable stands near the doors that you enter. As you leave each Sunday, there will be a box near each door in which to drop your tag. The tags will be sorted and hung for the following week.

To get this process started, we need your help to return your previous name tag ASAP, as we will have to order some new holders, clips, etc.

<u>If you have your nametag</u>, please place it (<u>as is</u>, with the lanyard or clip and regardless of the condition) in the box labeled NAME TAGS.


<u>If you don't have a name tag.</u> print your name on a piece of paper and put it in the box so we make sure you get one. There will be a sign-up sheet later if you need more time.

Celebrate Communion - Study Overview


Ever since Jesus took bread, gave thanks, shared it with his disciples, and told followers to do this in his memory, Christians have reenacted the moment. Over time, services of communion have been created and discussions about just what should be included have resulted in liturgies and prayers that pass on from generation to generation. Although Christians agree on the importance of communion, the meaning and practice of communion is multi-faceted and rich.

Throughout this unit, participants will learn that communion is a physical act, a spiritual gift, and a call for a pattern for living, in which we receive the gifts of God, give thanks, break them open, and share them with one another and the world. These actions of taking, blessing, breaking, and giving are central to the unity to the body of Christ. The four dimensions of the practice discussed include: give thanks, share meals, be fed, and feed others.

WANTED: WOMEN INTERESTED IN A WOMEN'S SMALL GROUP




