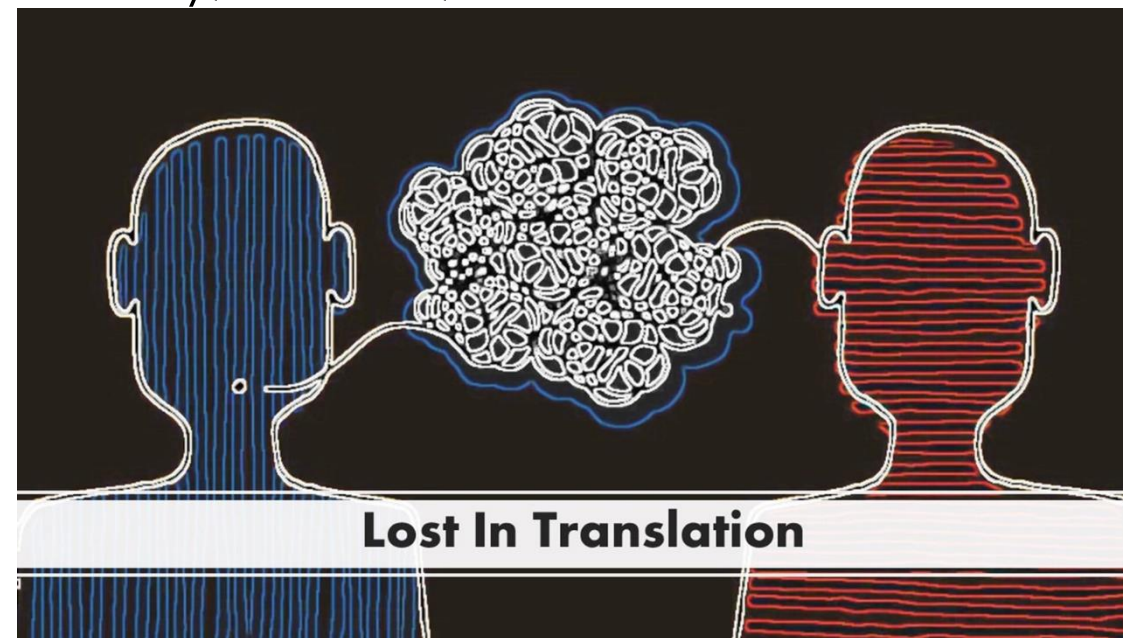

Monthly Mission Collections

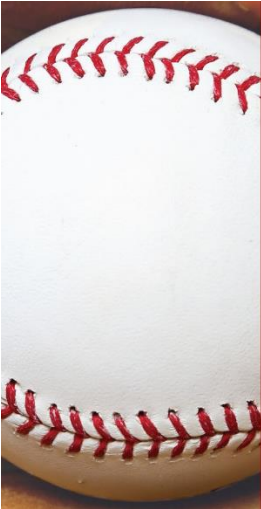

Opportunities with our new partner THRIVE:

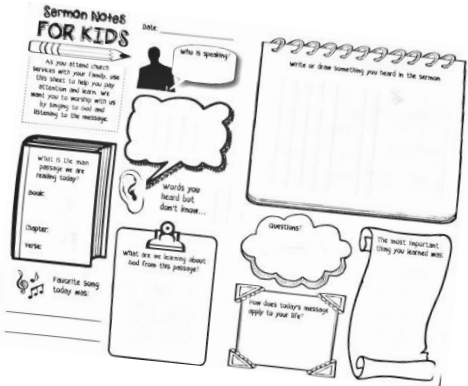


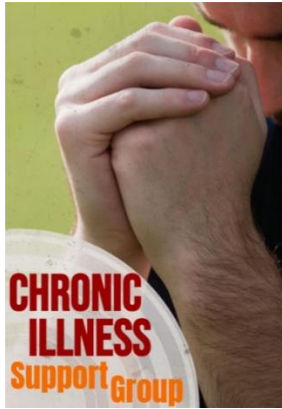

Little Free Food Pantry

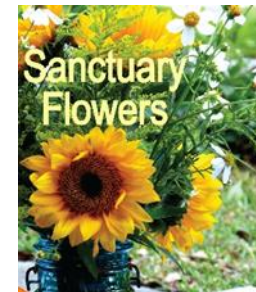
