



Advent 2023 Devotional Available!

If you haven't gotten the advent devotional yet, you pick it up today or order it online yourself, especially if you'd like a Kindle version: <u>A Surprising God: Advent Devotions for... by Long, Thomas G. (amazon.com)</u> The reading schedule is as follows:

- 12/3 12/10 = The first week of Advent (days 1-7)
- 12/10 12/17 = The second week of Advent (days 1-7)
- 12/17 12/24 = The third week of Advent (days 1-7)
- 12/24 12/31 = The fourth week of Advent (days 1-7)

So, yes, given the book's length, we'll be reading the last section during the first week of the Christmas season, but that's ok. There won't be any Sunday School on 12/24 or 12/31, so the 8:00 and larger 11:00 adult classes will finish up their discussion of the devotional on 1/7/24.
